Yet, even with all the time invested by everyone, the unfortunate reality is too many students may not complete all their college applications, may not have a viable college option to meet their needs at the end of senior year or may even withdraw or transfer in their first year if they do go to college. Hear why college lists matter to student outcomes, lessons learned in college counseling program design that led to targeted successful student outcomes and what this means to you in terms of strategies and resources.</p>

Particular attention will be given to the Ontario Domestic Assault Risk Assessment (ODARA), including its development and content, up-to-date validation studies, and its applications. Dr. Hilton will show how risk assessment fits within the Risk, Need, Responsivity principles of effective correctional service, and present recent studies on domestic violence treatment approaches and criminogenic needs, showing how tools like the ODARA can help improve both risk assessment and risk management.</p>

This webinar will empower school psychologists to create WAIPER schools which recognize the need for appropriate and positive school culture, climate, curriculum, and counseling.
September 14, 2022 1:00 pm - 2:30 pm	<u>Undoing Aloneness and the Transformation of Emotional Suffering into Flourishing with AEDP (Accelerated Experiential Dynamic Psychotherapy)</u>	APA	Members - \$35 Nonmembers - \$50	1.5 Credits	Aloneness in the face of overwhelming emotion is the epicenter of traumatic suffering, it is what brings our patients to seek help. Undoing aloneness is key to being able to process the overwhelming emotions of trauma. Accelerated Experiential Dynamic Psychotherapy (AEDP), one of the fastest growing approaches to healing attachment trauma, has developed creative, systematic interventions for undoing the patient's aloneness, and working dyadically and experientially to heal emotional suffering. AEDP also uses metatherapeutic processing, a methodology for bringing in-session flourishing about in trauma patients: it involves micro-tracking and experiential work with transformational experiences and culminates in vitality; energy; experiences of feeling seen; cared for and loved; and the non-finite positive emotion-fueled spirals of resilience and well-being.

The difficulty is not in the commitment to support students at risk; it's the use of protocols quantifying suicide. Determining suicide risk is problematic on many levels, not the least of which is the difficulty of assessing the risk. The domino effect of the shortage of faculty will compound the shortage of practitioners. If there continue to be open faculty positions, programs will either recruit and admit smaller numbers of students because of a lack of capacity to adequately advise and teach students or there will be significant increases of student to faculty ratios (Graves & Brown Wright, 2007). This presentation will highlight nontraditional career paths of practitioners moving into roles as faculty, and it will emphasize the benefit of moving into a faculty position after working in the field.</p>

The discussion will illustrate how therapists' balance the needs of clients, treatment procedures and other process variables that compete for attention at any one moment in the therapy hour. Therapists' capacity to be responsive and tailor treatments to their clients' cognitive, affective, and interpersonal processes at different points in the session and across time contributes to positive therapeutic outcomes (Norcross & Lambert, 2019; Norcross & Wampold, 2019).</p>
